



Kindergarten Homework



Kindergarten students will receive monthly homework calendars. These calendars (along with the corresponding sheets) will come home in their take home folders. Keep these packets at home in a highly visible, safe place.

Each day (Monday-Thursday) will have one or two assignments for the students to complete. (No worries! The activities will not be intense! They will be brief things for you to do to help your child succeed in school!) Some assignments are written while others are activities for your child to do orally. These activities will be described (if needed) on a sheet that will be attached to the calendar. **If any of the homework activities need to be turned in to me, it will be clearly marked on the homework calendar.**

I will send a new homework calendar home every month. The nightly homework will be discussed daily at school. Please be sure to complete the homework each night so your child can participate in our class discussions and activities.

Additionally, students should read or listen to an adult read at least one book every day. Please write down the books that you read with your child on the monthly book list. We participate in a program called "Book It" which runs from October through March. Your child will receive a coupon for a free personal pan pizza from Pizza Hut when the book list is turned in to me during these months.
