

LSHS National Merit Commended Students

Lisle Senior High School Principal, Pete Sullivan, is pleased to announce that three LSHS students have been awarded National Merit Commended Student Recognition for their performance on the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test ([PSAT/NMSQT[®]](#)). Seniors Neal Kfoury, Gregory Dzuricko, and Michael Swartz scored within the top 5% of the national college bound seniors taking the test.

The National Merit Scholarship Program began in 1955 and is a nationally recognized academic competition taken by approximately 1.5 million high school students across the country each year. In April following the fall test administration, high-scoring participants from every state are invited to name two colleges or universities to which they would like to be referred by NMSC. In September, these high scorers are notified through their schools that they have qualified as either a Commended Student or Semifinalist. Selection for National Merit Honors indicates a student is one of the top performing students across the country.
