

Tips for Parents

-Set up notebook to keep math notes, with a section for definitions of new words.

-Encourage them to make sure vocabulary are clear and up to date with appropriate use of diagrams.

-Keep in touch with your child to make sure they keep a list of general rules and laws in their notebook.

-Encourage your child to think of a name for each rule or law or draw a sketch to help remember it.

-Help out your child, have them tell you about the rule or law they learned in class.

-Work with your child to write sample questions and exchange them with other classmates.

-Develop a study plan to prepare for tests and quizzes such as: study groups, note cards, and by quizzing them.

-Discuss with your child the questions the teacher would most likely ask on the test to help them be prepared.

-Forming a study group on a regular basis would help your child learn math better.

-Take turns explaining concepts to each other to prepare and review.

-Make a list of concepts that they know and a list of all the concepts in the chapter and compare the two until they are the same list.

-Discuss what they learned in class and whether their expectations were met or not and why. Discuss whether there is something the student can do to help these expectations be met more efficiently.

-Encourage your student to do the best they can do.
